Reduced Pass Application



The Fremont Parks and Recreation Department offers reduced rates on annual passes at the Fremont Community Recreation Complex for qualified individuals and families within the City of Fremont and surrounding areas. Reduced pass applications must be completed in full, with the necessary documentation, in order to be considered.

Application Procedure

1. Complete and return, in full, the Fremont Parks & Recreation Reduced Pass Application (this form).
2. Submit current copy of tax return statement and most recent W2 form(s). If you do not file federal income taxes, please call 1-800-TAX-FORM (1-800-829-3676) for a verification letter.
3. Documentation on all current forms of income or other assistance:
 - A. Two (2) most recent pay stubs
 - B. Child support
 - C. Social Security Income (SSI)
 - D. Food Stamps
 - E. Unemployment
 - F. Medicaid

Applicant Acknowledgements & Disclosures

1. Any amount of reduction awarded will be used towards the cost of Annual Passes at the Fremont Community Recreation Complex. Reduction cannot be used towards programming or other City Services/ Departments.
2. It is solely the responsibility of the applicant to satisfactorily demonstrate financial need. No applicant will be discriminated against because of race, sex, color, national origin, beliefs or disabilities.
3. Applicant certifies that all information given is true and correct and that misrepresentation of information will disqualify the applicant from the reduced pass program.
4. Reduction in passes is based on income levels presented in the most recent Federal Poverty Guidelines.
5. All information provided will be handled confidentially and will be used only for eligibility determination and data verification.
6. All reduced passes expire on January 31st, of each year. Approved applicants must re-file their application annually. Applications that are not resubmitted by the deadline will be terminated.
